

Lesson 1 (entry 11,12, and 13)

1. 18th century in Europe and philosophical movement. That focused on ideas of reason, liberty, and individual rights.
2. John Locke: Natural Rights, Social Contract, and Consent of the Governed Montesquieu: Separation of Powers and Checks and balances
3. Government and the people. Government protects rights and People give up rights and give power
4. Natural Rights: rights that allow freedom for certain actions, born with, and cannot be taken away. Natural Law: laws given by the government to protect natural rights.
5. He influenced Thomas Jefferson and he wrote the Declaration of Independence.
6. He influenced the U.S. Constitution and James Madison

Lesson 2 (Entry 14)

1. Big Ideas of Government
 - a. Rule of Law: laws of a country are obeyed by all and no one is above the law.
 - b. Self-Government: people make decisions on the how the government should work
 - c. Limited Government: When the government has limited powers based on a governmental document
 - d. Rights: a set of things that people believe that they should be free to do
 - e. Due Process: people are treated equally under the law. People have the right to fair and reasonable laws.
2. ROL: Impeachment of presidents
Self-Government: Voting
Due-Process: jury duty, warrants, fair trial and punishments, notified of charges, and provided a lawyer.
Limited Government: U.S. Constitution, Separation of Powers and checks and balances
Rights: freedom of speech, religion, petition the government.
3. Influential Documents
 - A. Magna Carta: Limited king's power and protected nobility
 - B. Mayflower Compact: created the government and provided order and protections for colonist
 - C. English Bill of Rights: expanded powers for parliament, the people, and limited the powers of the King.
 - D. Common Sense: pamphlet written to convince the American Colonist to support becoming independent from England.
